SYNOPSIS

A resolution has been prepared to continue the Village's participation in the Suburban Tree Consortium and to authorize tree supply and planting services in the amount of \$120,000 for 2007.

STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

A Beautiful Village is one of the eight principles identified in the Downers Grove Vision 2021 state ment. Among other things, this principle means *Tree Canopied Streets*.

FISCAL IMPACT

The adopted FY2007 General Fund budget provides \$120,000 for the purchase of tree supply and planting services in two separate accounts. The Forestry and Grounds account has \$75,000 budgeted for the annual parkway tree planting program for spring and fall of 2007, and the Community Events account has an additional \$45,000 budgeted for the 175th anniversary tree planting project.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval on the April 3, 2007 consent agenda.

BACKGROUND

The Village obtains tree supply and planting services through the Suburban Tree Consortium (STC), which currently has 33 municipal members. Downers Grove has been active in this group since 1987. The STC provides members with a consistent supply of quality trees of the species and varieties requested for the municipal parkways in an efficient and cost effective manner by maintaining contracts with several northern Illinois nurseries. Members have two options for selecting tree supply: 1) Members can place tree orders up to five years in advance at fixed prices, ensuring that the variety of trees they desire are available for a given year; or 2) Members can purchase trees in the current year at fixed prices, allowing for annual adjustment depending on need and availability. For each of the next five years, members have advance ordered over 1,500 trees. With each planting season, members add to their orders such that collectively, STC members purchase over 5,400 trees annually.

The adopted budget provides for tree planting during both spring and fall of 2007. This spring, 230 trees are scheduled with 175 of these as a part of the 175th Anniversary project. The Fall planting is anticipated at 245 trees. Downers Grove annually plants about 300 trees. Some examples of tree purchases during the last year by surrounding communities are: Hinsdale 112 trees, Lisle 102 trees, Lombard 369 trees and Westmont 109 trees.

The STC requires that municipalities present a resolution annually. Included in the resolution to continue with the STC is a list of trees that staff has advance-ordered for Downers Grove. The order includes trees that are more difficult to obtain, as well as those species that are typically requested by residents. The advance-ordering process has allowed staff to secure and obtain interesting trees such as miyabe maple and various new hybrid elms that are more resistant to Dutch elm disease. The advance order is a conservative quantity to ensure flexibility and the ability to add trees with each planting season subject to need. For over ten years, Forestry staff has been working with an increasing number of residents to ensure that their tree preferences are honored when practical.

**A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING INTENT TO CONTINUE
PARTICIPATION IN THE SUBURBAN TREE CONSORTIUM AND
TO AUTHORIZE CERTAIN PURCHASES FOR FY 2007**

WHEREAS, the Village of Downers Grove has heretofore joined the cooperative known as the Suburban Tree Consortium and has, on August 17, 2004, previously adopted Resolution No. 04-51 entitled "A Resolution Expressing Intent to Continue to Participate in the Suburban Tree Consortium"; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has determined that it is necessary and desirable to authorize purchases from the tree consortium for FY 2007 and to amend the policy as established in Resolution No. 04-51 as provided herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, in DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Village does hereby express its intent to remain a member of the Suburban Tree Consortium and to procure parkway trees through the Consortium, subject to sufficient annual budgeting therefore for the five-year period. A summary of the anticipated 5-year order is attached.

SECTION 2. The Village Manager is authorized to cause the purchase of trees and other vegetation in an amount of \$120,000.00 in addition to net proceeds of the money collected as fines for damaged trees as recommended by the Village Forester for FY 2007.

SECTION 3. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts of ordinances and resolutions, in conflict with this resolution are hereby rescinded.

SECTION 4. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Suburban Tree Consortium Secretariat at the West Central Municipal Conference Office.
