#### SYNOPSIS

A motion is requested to authorize award of a contract to Giant Maintenance & Restoration of Mundelein, Illinois for fire hydrant painting in the amount of \$47,130.80.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

The Five Year Plan and Goals identifies *Top Quality Village Infrastructure and Facilities*. A supporting objective of this goal is *Upgraded Water System*.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The FY09 Budget includes \$56,000 in the Water Fund for fire hydrant painting.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Approval on the April 21, 2009, consent agenda.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The contract to provide services for fire hydrant painting was competitively bid for 2009, with six bids received as summarized below. The contract amount is based on painting 478 hydrants generally between 67<sup>th</sup> Street and the southern Village boundary. Fire hydrants are painted on a five year cycle.

Fire hydrant painting services were provided in 2008 by Alpha Paintworks of Chicago, Illinois at a cost of \$77.50 per hydrant, and they have bid the lowest price for 2009. However, as the attached Contractor Evaluation Form shows, their job performance in 2008 was unsatisfactory. There were multiple issues with overspray and damage to public and private property. As a result, staff is not recommending Alpha Paintworks. The second low bidder, Great Lakes Protective Coatings, submitted an incomplete bid package and therefore is not a responsive bid. Giant Maintenance & Restoration successfully completed the Village's annual fire hydrant painting program in 2006 and was determined by staff to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for this year's program.

Provide details if early or late completion: Contract bid amount was to paint 515 but due to weather they were stopped completed 501.				
Change Orders (attach information if needed): None				
<u>Difficulties</u> / Positives: There were several complaints from residents that the contractor caused property damage. Calls were generally related to overspray. There were also calls relating to damage to landscape around fire hydrants such as flowers and grass. The contractor assured staff they were using a protective shield around hydrants as they were blasted and painted but found out later they were not using any protective shield or coverings as all.				
Interaction with public:

The contractor could have advised the resident or Village staff about plants and things in the way of the hydrant that they knew might be damaged during the sandblasting and painting process.				
General Level of Satisfaction with work:				
Staff was not satisfied with the work that was completed and had to create a punch list with 12 locations that had damage to property that finally was completed at the end of September. Staff also spent an inordinate amount of time checking up on the contractor and had to send them back to several hydrants to touch up. As the project progressed it seemed like the contractor was rushing to get done faster and the quality of their work started to drop, damage started to occur and hydrants were not getting completed properly.
