SYNOPSIS

A motion is requested to authorize a change order to an existing contract with Naperville Excavating, Inc. of Naperville, IL, for the McCollum Park Stormwater Improvement Project (SW-034). The amount of the proposed change order, \$27,123.00, would increase the existing contract amount from \$1,175,303.28 to \$1,202,426.28. This is the first change order for the McCollum Park Stormwater Project.

STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

The Five Year Plan and Goals for 2008-2013 identified *Top Quality Village Infrastructure and Facilities*. A supporting objective of this goal is *Improve Neighborhood Infrastructure Curbs*, *Gutters*, *Streets*, *Sidewalks*, *Stormwater and Drainage System*.

FISCAL IMPACT

The adopted FY09 budget includes \$1,250,000 in the Stormwater Improvement Fund for all projects in Prentiss Creek, Subwatershed B (SW-034).

RECOMMENDATION

Approval on the July 7, 2009 consent agenda.

BACKGROUND

On April 7, 2009, the Village Council awarded a contract to Naperville Excavating, Inc. of Naperville, IL, for the McCollum Park Stormwater Improvement Project (SW-034). The contract was to provide stormwater detention in the form of one detention facility located at the northwest section of the Park District-owned property, McCollum Park. The detention facility, in conjunction with other projects, would alleviate drainage issues along Fairmount Ave from 61st Street to 67th Street and along 67th Street west of Blackstone Drive. Storage gained with the proposed detention basin will allow water to drain more efficiently from upstream areas, thus reducing flooding elevations. The project also consists of relocating a basketball court and volleyball court, the construction of a new soccer field with an underdrain system and irrigation system, and various park amenities.

The contractor has submitted the first change order associated with the McCollum Park Stormwater Improvement Project. The total amount of the proposed change order, \$27,123.00, would increase the existing contract amount from \$1,175,303.28 to \$1,202,426.28. The proposed change order includes additional costs for the following items:

- The construction entrance will be revised to include two sets of gates that will provide protection for pedestrian traffic
- Additional soil excavation will be included due to unsuitable sub-base material in the basketball area
- The extension of fence posts due to relocating the fence around the volleyball and basketball courts
- Extra tree work (root pruning, limb pruning, tree removal) required to construct the volleyball/basketball courts.

In addition to these project costs, the proposed change order includes a credit to the Village for the following item:

• A revised point of connection for the proposed electrical feed for the new lighting system. The new location will avoid any inconvenience to the public due to the required work to connect the lighting system at the concession stand as proposed. The new electric route allows for a less expensive conduit material.


