SYNOPSIS

A motion is requested to award a contract for the Wallbank Avenue Drainage Improvements to Naperville Excavating Co. of Naperville, Illinois in the amount of \$322,193.00.

STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

The Five Year Plan and Goals for 2008-2013 identified *Top Quality Village Infrastructure and Facilities*. A supporting objective of this goal is *Improve Neighborhood Infrastructure Curbs, Gutters, Streets, Sidewalks, Stormwater and Drainage System*.

FISCAL IMPACT

The adopted FY10 budget for all planned projects within the St. Joseph North, Subwatershed C (SW-033) is \$6,000,000. This budget includes an estimated amount of \$3,200,000 for the construction of the Sterling North Park Stormwater Improvement project, and the remaining amount is designated for this Wallbank Avenue Drainage Improvement project, as well as seven smaller drainage improvement projects along Chicago Avenue.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval on the December 15, 2009 consent agenda.

BACKGROUND

The Wallbank Avenue Drainage Improvements project will help alleviate stormwater flooding at the intersection of Warren Avenue and Wallbank Avenue, as well as improve the stormwater infrastructure along Wallbank Avenue and within an LPDA just south of Prairie Avenue, east of Wallbank Avenue. The full benefits of these improvements will be experienced after the completion of the Sterling North Park Stormwater Improvement project.

Bids were received on Thursday, November 12, 2009. A synopsis of the bids is as follows:

The low bidder is Naperville Excavating Company. This bidder has received positive references for quality work and management from Chicago suburban agencies such as the Village of Bolingbrook, the Village of Naperville, and the City of Wheaton. Naperville Excavating Company's scope of work over

the last few years includes the construction of recreational fields, retention pond dredging, road reconstruction, and mass excavation projects such as McCollum Park Stormwater Improvements, all ranging from \$150,000 to \$1,200,000.


Detailed design began in 2008. Meetings with the Park District and affected residents were held. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2009.
