
Village Council November 15, 2022







- Enacted by the State of Illinois and became effective January 1, 2022
- Inventory of lead service lines by April 2024
- Replace all lead service lines from 2027 to 2044
- Use good faith efforts to contract with vendors owned by minority persons, women and persons with a disability



- Lead service lines must be replaced when:
 - either the public or private section is damaged
 - a property owner initiates a service line replacement
 - adjacent water main is replaced
- Both sections must be replaced*
- Village can charge property owner for cost of private section unless Federal or State funds are used



*property owner may opt out of private side replacement by signing a waiver

- There are an estimated 1,500 to 3,000 existing lead service lines in the Village
- Lead service line inventory in 2024 will confirm the actual number of lead services
- Estimated <u>annual</u> cost:
 - \$200,000 in FY23 through FY26
 - \$2 Million from FY27 through FY44



Proposed Approach to Responsibility for Private Side of Service

Scenario:	Who Pays?
 Required Due To Addition or New Construction Building addition that requires replacement of the service New construction that requires replacement of the service 	Property owner pays for and installs public and private side
Property Owner Initiated Replacement No specific reason Leak/damage on private side of service	Property owner pays for and installs private side Village pays for and installs public side
Village Initiated Replacement Village replaces adjacent water main Leak/damage on public side of service Planned service replacement (FY27 and beyond)	Village pays for and installs public and private side*



*Property owners may refuse to have the private section of a lead service line replaced provided that they sign a waiver and install a water filter (provided by the Village).
