1. How often is the "4-hour rule" for staff time used? Does staff think that 4 hours is the appropriate duration?

The "4-hour rule" has been used on very few occasions over the past few years. The current New Business procedures and Long Range Plan Priority Action Items efforts have been used very effectively in recent years and have reduced the use of the "4-hour rule." Almost all work is initiated by the Council as a group (Priority Action Items) or through the New Business process.

The most recent use of Council directed work has been completed in conjunction with New Business items. Pursuant to Council policy, staff may spend up to four hours completing preliminary research on New Business items prior to the items being presented to the Council on a meeting agenda, if requested.

Staff thinks that four hours is the appropriate duration for this type of work. Any work product prepared under the "4 hour rule" is provided to the entire Council.
